About the College

Periyar Arts College, run by Government of Tamil Nadu, is situated on the seashore of Bay of Bengal at Devanampattinam Village, 200 km South of Chennai on the East Coast Road. The College has been named after "Thanthai Periyar" E.V.Ramasamy, the Great Rationalist and Social Reformer.

Periyar Arts College was started in 1964 at Cuddalore by the efforts of South Arcot development corporation. Initially 360 students were admitted in four different branches in the Pre-University Course. In its inception, the college functioned in the District Board Buildings and then the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madras Thiru M. Bakthavasalam inaugurated the college on 06.09.1964.In 1965, the college was upgraded to First Grade College. From 1970, the college is functioning in its own building.

In 1965 B.A Course in English Literature, Economics and B.Sc Course in Mathematics were introduced. B.Com. course was introduced in 1973. B.Sc. Chemistry and Physics were started in 1979. B.Sc. Botany and B.A History were introduced in 1980. B.Sc. Zoology was started in 1982. The college introduced M.Com degree course in 1986. B.Sc. Industrial Chemistry was introduced during the academic year1996- 97 with the financial assistance of U.G.C. B.Sc. Computer Science and course was also started in the same year. During the academic year 2005-06, B.A Tamil Literature and M.Sc. Mathematics were started.

During the academic year 2011-12 B.Sc. Statistics and P.G Courses in English Literature, History and Botany were started. During the academic year 2012-13 P.G Courses in Tamil, Economics, Physics, Zoology and Computer Science were started. During the academic year 2013-14 B.A Political Science, B.Sc. Micro Biology, and M.Sc. Chemistry were started.

In 2005, Periyar Arts College was accredited by NAAC with C++ grade in the first Cycle. Periyar Arts College, in the process of NAAC Re-accreditation, has secured 'B' Grade status with 2.43 CGPA on 3rd March, 2015. For the welfare of the students four units of NSS and YRC are functioning. In 2005-06 college NSS units received award for best NSS units from Thiruvalluvar University.

From the Academic year 2007-08 the college is functioning in two shifts (Shift I & Shift II). B.A Tamil literature, B.A English literature, Commerce, Economics and B.Sc. Chemistry and B.Sc. Computer Science were started in Sift-II.

In the academic year 2014-15, research Programme M. Phil. And Ph.D. in Tamil and Botany have been introduced.

In September 2015, aiming at academic accolades, Periyar Arts College started 23 newcourses namely B.Sc. Visual Communication, M.A. Public Administration, Master of Social Work (MS W), Part-Time and Full-Time M.Phil. programmes in English, Economics, Computer Science, Zoology, Physics and Microbiology, Part-Time and Full-Time Ph.D. courses in English, History, Physics, Zoology and Microbiology.

In the academic year 2018-19, P.G Course Political Science, research courses M.Phil. & Ph.D in courses in English, History, Mathematics and Chemistry and Ph.D in Computer Science have been started.

- 1. Students who have got admission using forged certificate will be removed from the college and no fees amount will be refunded.
- Students, who join in the middle of the semester, have to pay the full fees.
 Otherwise their admission will not be accepted.
- 3. Students, who have paid the fees, but leave the college in the middle of the academic year, they have to apply for Transfer certificate within a year. Otherwise they have to pay Rupees Six (Rs. 6) additionally.
- 4. Students who seek duplicate Transfer certificate, after leaving the college, have to pay Rupees eight along with the application duly signed by the government Police officer.
- 5. Students can get attendance certificate, if they are eligible with attendance percentage.

Students join from other colleges affiliated to Thiruvalluvar University have to attach the following certificates with their application.

- 1. Qualifying Certificate (Mark Statement)
- 2. Migration Certificate
- 3. Prescribed fees amount's receipt.(Bank receipt or cash receipt)

University Attendance regulations:

- 1. An academic year consists of 180 working days. There are two semesters per year, hence 90 working days per semester. For each semester attendance would be calculated and students are allowed for examination based on their eligible attendance percentage.
- 2. Students who have attended 67.5 (75%) days and above out of 90 working days are eligible for taking up their university examination.
- 3. Students who have attendance below 67.5 to 56.5 i.e. below 75% and above 65% have to pay a condonation fee of Rs.1000/-(thousand only) to apply for university examination.
- 4. Students who have attendance below 56.5 and above 49.5 (i.e. above 55% and below65%) will not be permitted to take up their university examination. They will be allowed to continue their studies in the next semester. They will be permitted to take up those examinations in the next semester by paying Rs. 1000/-as condonation fees.
- 5. Students who have below 49.5% attendance (i.e. below 55%) will not be permitted to continue second and third year studies. They have to redo the course in the next academic year by applying to the University through the Principal.
- 6. Students studying science courses should possess 75% attendance to take up their practical examination, failing which they have to follow the above- mentioned rules to take up their practical examination.

Guidelines for Tuition Fee Payment

- 1. Tuition fee should be paid promptly before the due date as mentioned in the circular. Failing which, one rupee per day will be collected as fine till the month end. If students fail to pay within the grace period, their names will be removed from the enrollment list. They have to join again by paying their fee amount, along with fineRs.5 as joining fee.
- 2. From the date in which name of the student removed from the enrollment and till the date of rejoining, the attendance will not be given for those days.
- 3. Fees paying time in office: From Morning 10.30A.M to afternoon1.30P.M only.

Details of various scholarships for students:

1. National eligibility Scholarship-Indian Government Scheme:

National Eligibility Scholarship will be awarded to limited students studying in 11th & 12th classes and Diploma Course. Students will be selected for this scholarship based on their marks in SSLC, HSC and Degree Course. The committee will select the qualifying students. Students whose parents fall under the criteria set by the Directorate of Collegiate Education will receive a monthly scholarship. For the parents who do not fall under these criteria, their children will receive a consolation prize of Rs. 100 along with a certificate. To avail this scholarship, they should not receive any other scholarships. The annual income of the parent should not exceed Rs.12000 after allowing 30% or Rs.10000 deduction.

2. Endowment Scholarship for School Teacher's Children:

After deduction of Rs. 10,000 from annual income, school teachers, if they have less than Rs.12,000 as remaining, then their children are eligible for this scholarship. Applications are invited through reputed newspaper advertisement. Based on merit, the selection list will be made.

3. State Government scholarship for proficiency:

Students who get first rank in 10th, Matriculation and AISLE, B.Sc., and B.A., would be given scholarship without considering parents income. This scholarship will be given from 10th to college education.

4. Scholarship for Freedom Fighters Children:

Children of Freedom Fighters (who fought for India's freedom and imprisoned for 3 months) can get concession in their tuition fees along with scholarship. It is applicable for those who study in Arts and Diploma courses.

5. Scholarship for Army Soldier's Children:

Terms and conditions are applicable to avail this scholarship. It includes concession in Tuition fees and Scholarship.

6. Scholarship for Sri Lankan Refugee's Children:

With some Terms and conditions Sri Lankan refugee's children can avail this scholarship, which includes concession intuition fees.

7. National Educational Loan:

Based on education qualification and conditions this scholarship given. Student Parent's annual income should not exceed Rs. 12000 to avail this scholarship. Every year applications are invited through advertisement in reputed Newspapers.

8. Adhoc Scholarship:

SC/ST and converted Christian students who score above 60% marks in their first attempt in 12th standard can get Rs. 300 as scholarship. There is no income limit and no need to renew this.

9. Government Scholarship for College Students:

Below scholarships have been offered by State Government

(i)General (ii) Higher Education (iii) Scholarship for Languages (Tamil &Telugu) (iv) Special Scholarship for Muslims (v) Special Scholarship for Widows (vi) Special Scholarship for Southwest Education (vii) Chennai Lady Willington Special Scholarship (viii) Queen Mary College Special Scholarship (ix)Scholarship for Anglo-Indians Parent's whose annual income is less than Rs.6000 per year who does not receive any of the above said scholarships, can apply for any one of these scholarships, for which they are eligible. They get Rs. 270 per year. For No. 6 Rs.135 will be given. Most backward students need not pay their fees.

10. Tamil Medium Incentive:

Students studying through Tamil medium can avail incentive in cash. (Directorate of Collegiate education C.O.9937/D/477 dated: 3.10.1977)

G. Iyyappan Endowment Prize

Every year students accomplishing top three ranks in U.G Tamil degree will be awarded prizes through an endowment framed by Former MLA Mr. G. Iyyappan for a sum of rupees one lakh. The interest of this amount has been utilized to issue prizes for the toppers under the guidelines of Government of Tamil Nadu.

General Guidance for Students Applying for Scholarship

- 1. Students have to obtain the scholarship application from the office. The application has to be filled properly and submitted to the office.
- 2. Students have to apply the scholarship within 15 days from the date of joining.
- **3.** Before submitting the Scholarship application, it has to be verified in office at 4 p.m.
- **4.** Filled- in applications will be received at 4 p.m only. At any cost, applications will not be received during other timings.
- **5.** Students studying in first year have to obtain fresh application form to apply for their scholarship.
- **6.** Scholarship approval will be intimated to the students in their classes. To receive it, students should have a Bank account with MICR, IFSC number. Aadhaar Number is mandatory.
- 7. Scholarship amount will be credited only through Bank.
- Students, who obtained scholarship, have to sign the credit receipt in the office.
 Then only the amount will be credited to the students' bank account.
- **9.** Students, who discontinue their course, have to surrender their scholarship amount in full to the office.
- **10.** Students belonging to BC/SC/ST, who apply for government scholarship and fees waiver, should have above 75% attendance for every semester with reference to the Government G.O.660 dated on 24.03.1979. If they have less than 75%, they cannot get scholarship for that year as well as they are not eligible for the next academic year too. This rule is applicable to BC/SC/ST students, according to Tamil Nadu Government Educational rule 92. Students under the Ex-serviceman category and those receiving Ex-service man scholarship can also apply for the scholarship.
- **11.** For backward community, the scholarship is applicable if the student is the first graduate. For that, the Student has to bring the first graduate certificate from the Village Administrative Officer.

- **12.** SC students should have acquired a minimum of 60% marks or above to receive the scholarship.
- **13.** Physically Challenged Students can avail Government scholarship by submitting an application along with a medical certificate that certifies their disability. Photos should be attached along with the application.
- **14.** Students are entitled to receive only one scholarship at a time. Therefore they can choose the scholarship with maximum benefits

Placement Cell

The Primary function of this cell is to seek the placement opportunities for the final year UG Students of this college. In addition, it also conducts various other activities like group discussion and interviews. Students are trained to face interviews boldly by providing necessary guidance and information regarding placement.

Computer Literacy Programme

Computer Literacy programme was initiated in this institution from the academic year2000-2001. The beneficiaries of this programme are the first year students of all the UG Courses other than B.Sc. Computer Science. Seven Computer instructors are workingunder this programme. At the end of the program students will get certificate given by the government. The certificate can be registered in employment exchange.

National Cadet Corps

There are three decisions in National Cadet Corps Army, Navy and Air. In this college students are admitted in naval division. To increase the efficiency of students, training is given in personality, communication skill and in navy activities. If they pass in examination after getting training at the college level, they would get B and C certificate.

National Service Scheme

Four units of National Service Scheme comprising student volunteers have organized with an objective to render education through social work.

- 1. The students should volunteer for the programme for a minimum period of 2years.
- 2. Each volunteer has to render his/her service for a minimum of 120 hours per

year, according to the special service scheme approved by the university.

 Educational activities, social works, health services, social welfare services, national welfare services are some of the activities that are organized by the National Service Scheme.

Physical Education

- Physical training is compulsory for both I and II year students. Attendance and certificates will not be awarded to students who violate the code of conduct duringthe training period. The Students must possess a minimum of 75% of attendance to receive a certificate at the time of completion of the training. Certificates will be awarded based on the merits of the student's participation.
- 2. Given below is some of the physical training for which certificates will be awarded:
 - i. Indoor games/Outdoor games.
 - ii. Rigorous physical training that fosters discipline.
 - iii. 45 minutes of physical training twice a week has to be done.
- 3. Medical certificate issued by a physician exclusively appointed by the Head of the Institution.
- 4. The Students can take part in Sports and Games from 4.p.m to 6 p.m. In addition to the compulsory physical regime, coaching to participate in other games is also given.

Parents Teachers Association

Parents Teachers Association has been functioning effectively in the college.

Alumni Association

Alumni Association was initiated in this institution from the academic year 2008-2009. The out- gone students of this college can become members of this association and work for the growth and development of this institution.

Citizen's Consumer Club

Citizen's Consumer Club was initiated in this college during the academic year 2008-2009. The primary function of this club is to initiate awareness among students regarding consumer's rights by educating them about the laws and acts related to consumer welfare and security. This club has been functioning successfully with the aid of 50student-volunteers.

Youth Red Cross

In this college, Youth Red Cross actively provides timely services like first aid and extends support at the time of natural disaster. It also involves in activities which develop and strengthen the national unity. Moreover, it also participates actively in donating blood.

Ban on Ragging in College

As per the Tamil Nadu Government anti-ragging act, ragging is strictly prohibited in educational institutions. Hence, ragging is considered as a punishable offence. If the alleged student is proved to be involved either in ragging and even motivating such act will be sentenced for 2 years of imprisonment along with the penalty of Rs.10,000.

Students Cooperative Society

Having been registered properly, the student's co-operative society has been functioning in a systematic manner. The students, teachers and other employees act as the prime members of this student's cooperative society. The special feature of this society is to sell the purchased books, notebooks, observation notes and other stationeries in subsidized price.

Library

Library Card:

- Each Student will be provided with an identity card with which the books can be borrowed from the library. The books will not be loaned unless the borrower produces his/her library Card.
- 2. The borrower must ensure the safety of the library card. In case of missing the cards, it should be immediately informed to the Librarian. The borrower must pay a fine of Rs.2 if the missing card is not traced within 15 days.
- 3. One should not lend one's library card to someone else for which the borrower will be held solely responsible for the book that has been borrowed.
- 4. The borrower should hand over the library card either before leaving the college or the day before 31st of March. "No Dues" will not be issued to the students unless he/she returns his/her library card to the librarian. It is to be noted that students without "No Dues" will be restricted from appearing for the university exams. Moreover, TC will not be issued to such borrowers.

RULES FOR LENDING AND BORROWING BOOKS

- 1. The students are allowed to borrow only one book at a time with a single library card.
- 2. The library books must be returned within15days.
 - a) The students must return the loaned book within the due date mentioned inside the book. The student has to pay Rs.1 per day as penalty in case of unreturned books. Eventually, his / her membership is liable to be cancelled. If the due date falls on holidays, the books can be returned in the subsequent working days.

The books must be returned two days earlier before the due date if the librarian has demanded for it. If the student fails to return the book within the days mentioned by the librarian, the book must be returned along with the fine amount fixed by the Principal.

- 3. Markings, scribbling, underlining, tearing papers, removing pages must not be done in the books that are loaned from the library. If any such damage is found, the borrower is held highly responsible for the damages. Hence, it is suggested that the borrower must check for any damages in the circulation desk itself to avoid the future inconveniences. Under such circumstances, the borrower is demanded to replace the damaged books with new books along with a fine amount fixed by the Principal.
- 4. Irregular attendance or any physical ailments will not be considered as reason for the late return of the books.
- 5. In the event of missing the books, it should be informed to the librarian immediately so that from that reported date onwards, the fine amount for the late return of the books will be withheld. However, the borrower must replace a new bookalong with a fine amount fixed by the Principal within the due date fixed by the librarian.
- 6. The books must be borrowed and returned within the due date. The date of applying for books will be informed. The students can apply for books through the applications issued by the librarian. Applications must be handed over to the librarian within the last date of submission. Submission Time: 10.30 a.m. to3.00 p.m.
- 7. Renewal: One can renew his/her loaned book unless other borrower has applied for it.
- 8. New Method: The books that are highly in demand will be issued through registration method. The order of registration will be considered while lending the book for the students. The books that were borrowed under this method must be returned with in the due date mentioned inside the book or the borrower will be penalized.
- 9. Silence should be maintained within the library zone. Students are not allowed to carry their personal things inside the library.

Student's Code of Conduct

- 1. Students must be well informed about their attendance, scholarship, examinations and other particulars by their concerned tutor. However, either the Principal or the H.O.Ds' must not be approached for the above-mentioned reasons.
- 2. The students must maintain their dress code. They must come in a neat and clean dress. Casual wears like T-Shirts and Jeans are strictly prohibited.
- 3. Whenever students meet the teachers for the first time in the college campus, they should wish them as a mark of respect.
- 4. Whenever the teacher is inside the class room, the students must maintain discipline.
- 5. Students are not allowed to leave the class room during the class hours without the permission of the teachers. When the teacher leaves the classroom, the students are allowed to disperse.
- 6. No one is allowed to invite students from other classes during the class hours unless he/she is called by the Principal.
- 7. When the students are transposing from one class to another, silence and decorum should be maintained.
- 8. The Students should not roam within the college campus during the class hours.
- 9. The Students must not arrange for any meeting or collect money from their peer group without the permission of the Head of the Institution.
- 10. Smoking, burning waste papers and smearing the college compound walls are considered as serious offences.
- 11. Absenteeism and influencing other fellow students for absenteeism is considered as an in-disciplinary act.
- 12. Students are not allowed to sit on the railings of the college veranda.
- 13. The student must bring the exact fee amount for payment.
- 14. The Student must follow the queue system and should maintain silence.
- 15. If a student is absent for more than 15 days, his/her name will be cancelled from the attendance register.
- 16. Mobile Phones are strictly prohibited within the college campus.
- 17. Students should not damage college property.
