Library

Our college library has been performing well. Throughout this academic year, we have acquired new books for various departments totaling Rs 2,00,000. The library operates using a partially computerized system, allowing for efficient organization and access to resources. Students have been actively utilizing the library's offerings, demonstrating a strong interest in furthering their academic pursuits.

Disabled Welfare Unit

The Disabled Welfare Unit at our college is dedicated to supporting the educational development of disabled students. This unit provides guidance and alternative skills to help students succeed. Buildings reconstruction

Our College buildings have been renovated through the Public Works department with a fund of one crore rupees from the Tamil Nadu government. Rs.1,36,00,000 is being provided by the Tamil Nadu government in this academic year to build two buildings with 32 classrooms. Also 354 chairs have been purchased by the higher education department fund at the cost of 10 lakhs. The construction work for the building with six classrooms is in progress at a cost of 60 lakhs from RUSA Fund. Rs.1 Crore from the NLC CSR fund for the construction of the auditorium has been allotted and approval has been obtained from the district collector. Lawns are being laid in front of the college to give it a beautiful look. Aquaculture and pond renovation work is in progress under the supervision of Zoology Department.

Education Scholarship

Education Scholarships were awarded to students belonging to the Backward Class, Most Backward Class, and SC/ST categories, totaling 5096 scholarships which includes incentives for students enrolled in Tamil medium

Furthermore, the Government of Tamil Nadu has allocated Rs. 1,75,000/- to the science departments for the procurement of laboratory equipment, machinery, and maintenance work. This funding will enhance the learning experience and practical skills of students in these departments.

Arupadaiveedu Medical College, in collaboration with the social work department of our college, conducted a special medical camp. The Department of Social work has done a great job in the *Let us Teach and Learn Scheme* (Karppom Karpippom) for girls.

Our College's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is functioning well. IQAC has organized a webinar on econtent development on 09.06,20. A five day FDP was conducted online by IQAC on virtual tools for conducting online classes from 06.07.20. to 10.07.20, This cell is implementing various programs to motivate students.
