



# ACADEMIC AND ADMISTRATIVE AUDIT REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2022-2023

The Academic and administrative audit was conducted on 15th Dec 2023. The detailed observations are given below.

# 1) CURRICULAR ASPECTS:

All the Departments meet the curricular aspects effectively with the following:

- Every department has proper subject allocation with Department timetable.
- Lesson plans for individual staff are available.
- The Curriculum Delivery is effectively performed with peer teaching and assignments.
- All Departments have Department Associations and they have conducted activities.
- Students undergo projects/ field trips.

#### REMARKS:

Though the College is an affiliating college and follows the curriculum of Annamalai University, more Field trips and Industry visits may be encouraged beyond the curriculum.

## II) TEACHING LEARNING:

The college strictly follows the TamilNadu state Government reservation policy for admitting students. During the academic year 2022-2023 1898 students were admitted. 675 SC Students, 15 ST Students and 580 OBC students were admitted among the 1898 students. There is a good demand for all the courses. As per the government recommendations, 10% to 20% of seats are increased based on the demand for admission.

# III) RESEARCH INNOVATION AND EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:

There are 12 research departments in the college offering part time and full time research courses. Currently there are 112 research scholars pursuing research in various courses. There are 83 research supervisors available in the college. In the academic year 2022-2023, 45 research papers published in journals and 21 books are published in various conference proceedings. Various outreach programs were conducted in the college nearly 52 events are organized and 3851 students have participated in the extension activities. There are 4 Memorandum of agreement between Periyar Arts College and various companies.

#### IV) INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES:

The College has adequate infrastructure and Physical Facilities for teaching and learning. 114 class rooms are available. Lab Facilities are sufficient as the lab and class rooms are Common for shift 1 and shift 2 classes.

The Following Facilities are available

- Meeting Hall/ Mini auditorium with 300 seats.
- Football play field 45 or 90mts.
- Volley ball court 18 into 9mts
- Non Standard 400mt track.
- Mini multipurpose indoor room.
- Mini Gym.

In order to enhance the teaching learning process 3 Departments are equipped with projectors. Library is well equipped. 57138 Books are available in the college library. IT Facilities are sufficient and internet facilities are available with 200mbps.

#### **REMARKS:**

More ICT classes shall be encouraged.

Students shall be motivated to join more online courses.

There are adequate number of books in the library.

# v) STUDENTS SUPPORT PROGRESSION:

During the academic year 2022-2023, 5016 students are benefited through scholarships. Besides Government scholarships, Sri G lyyappan Charitable Endowment Fund also supports the outstanding student of Tamil Department. Soft skill courses are conducted with support from TANSCHE, life skill and ICT Computing skill courses are taught. The career guidance and placement cell provides guidance for students.

The grievances of students are collected through online and offline mode. The grievances are addressed through grievance redressal committee. ICC, Women cell, anti-ragging committee deals with women and ragging related issues. The Students perform well in Sports and the students have participated in 306 events this year. 67 awards and medals have been won by the students in various events. There is a registered alumni association functioning in the college.

E-Governance is implemented in almost all the areas like administration, finance, accounts, admission, student support and examination.

The internal and external financial audits are conducted. Inter departmental stock verification is performed. The Institute supported by parent teacher associations with a grant of Rs.1425710 during the year 2022-2023. Besides this fund, OSA fund, MLA fund, MP fund are mobilized.

The IQAC Motivates and supports Periyar Arts College in the teaching learning process. The IQAC evaluates the college through a structured feedback system. IQAC meetings are conducted regularly. Two IQAC meetings were conducted during 2022-2023.

The waste wooden benches were recycled and converted into lab equipments and other forms.

There are rain water harvesting system, bore wells are available in the campus.

Warning and Signboards regarding ban on use of plastics are available in the campus.

The College has received appreciation from the district administration for its anti narcotics activities as "pugaiyilai illa kalvi niruvanam"
